Vermont Tottori Relations

The JASV, it's Sister Organization the Tottori International Exchange Foundation (TIEF) and several local partners are planning several interesting events focusing on craft echanges for this summer.

Larry Reibbecke, a JASV Board member and Dan Eckstein of YesterMorrow and Taniguchi-san of Tottori Prefecture have been developing a traditional Japanese woodworking craftes course to be offered at the YesterMorrow School in Warren, Vermont, in early Summer 2009. Details of the course are being finalized and will be available soon.

Next year, 2009, is the 400 anniversary of Sir. Champlain's settlement in this region. As part of this celebration, Burlington City Arts (BCA) will host a Tottori Folk-Art show entitled Burlington's Cultural Diversity-Traditional Japanese Folk-Art from Tottori. The Ox (\ddagger) is one of the 12-year cycle of animals which appear in the Chinese zodiac related to the Chinese calendar. The Year of the Ox is denoted by the character \oiint . Both characters are pronounced "ushi". Recent years of the ox were: 1913, 1925, 1937, 1949, 1961, 1973, 1985, 1997

Famous Oxen: Barack Obama, Bill Cosby, Billy Joel, Jane Fonda, Jack Nicholson, Walt Disney, Margaret Thatcher, Meg Ryan, Meryl Streep, Princess Diana.
