

#### **Report: Vermont Group visits Tottori**

A group of 10 Vermonters were guests of the Tottori Prefectural Government from August 3rd to 8 th to discuss the Tottori-Vermont Student Environmental Leadership Exchange program. The 11 member delegation included representatives from Green Across the Pacific, JASV, participating Vermont high schools (Harwood High School and Mt. Abe High School), and representatives from the Vermont state government.

The visit focused on preparations for two student exchanges as part of a joint Tottori-Vermont environmental education project. Plans are being made for exchange visits in the spring of 2011 - a group of Vermont students will visit Tottori and a second group of Japanese students will visit Vermont.

The group met with Governor Shinji Hirai, Tottori Prefecture, who strongly believes that this intensive cultural experience will be instrumental in cultivation cosmopolitanism and open-mindedness in these young people who will one day be charged with our futures.

In addition to meetings with the Govenor, the group met with high school, university, and museum officials.

A similar group from Tottori will be visiting Vermont this October.
